Posted Overseas?

Any SEND issues your child has should be declared at or before the time when a posting is offered. Please be aware that in order to accept your child into our school, we require you to complete and return to us the following documents prior to your arrival in Germany:

1) A Pupil Admissions Form

2) Appendix 2 of the Admission Form, the Pupil Information Profile (PIP). This is to be completed by the school that your child currently attends.

When we receive and assess the information, we will then be in a position to offer your child a place at our school and issue an Educational Clearance Certificate,

If further investigation is required to ensure that we can meet the needs of your child, a process known as a MASO (Multi-agency Assessment of Supportability Overseas) may be triggered.

What does SEND mean?

To us, SEND means any additional support your child may need to help them to achieve their potential in school (academically, physically or socially).

Our vision for children and young people with special needs and/or disabilities is the same as for all children and young people – that they achieve well at school; are well cared for, have their health needs met and lead happy and fulfilled lives.

What does SEND provision look like?

You can expect us to:

- Regularly check your child's progress and, if necessary, up-date you with any concerns we may have.
- Listen to any concerns you may have about your child's progress or needs they may have during the school day.
- Work with external agencies should the need arise.
- Provide support programmes that are tailored to your child's needs and administered by qualified members of staff.
- Provide the opportunity to speak and liaise with the class teacher or SENCO (face-to-face, email or phone calls)
- Provide personalised plans that will contain details of your child's learning programme including activities and targets.

We want the very best for your child and believe that when a child is happy they are more willing to learn. When a child experiences a learning, behaviour or self-esteem difficulty, it can often lead to frustration.

We offer a multi-sensory approach to learning in order to meet the needs of all learners. For example:
